

Graves for Children – Lower Churchyard

1. A formal written application must be made to St James the Great Church and authorisation granted by the church, **Before** the introduction of **Any** memorial and **Before** the introduction of **Any** additional inscription to an existing Headstone.
2. A **Maximum** of One Floral Tribute permitted.
It must be placed in the integral vase in the base of the Headstone or **on** the base of the Headstone if there is no integral vase.
No floral tributes permitted on the grass in front of the base of the Headstone.
3. No Glass Containers/Vases permitted.
4. No Brightly Coloured Containers permitted.
5. Only Cut Flowers or Seasonally Appropriate Silk Flowers are permitted, but they must be removed once they are decaying or have become faded.
6. Plastic Flowers and Metal Flowers are not permitted.
7. No Objects are permitted.
i.e No Toys, Ornaments, Balloons, Photographs, Candles, Lights etc.
8. No Fencing, Railings, Chains, Chippings or Individual Gardens permitted.
(Existing chippings within kerbstones of old graves may remain)
9. No Planting is permitted. i.e. No Shrubs, Trees, Rose Bushes, Bedding Plants etc.
10. No Floral Tributes or Objects are to be left on or around the Bench in the Churchyard.
11. The PCC reserves the right to remove any Objects which are not, or have ceased to be, Authorised under these Regulations and any Objects that are decaying or faded.
12. The PCC accepts No Responsibility for any Floral Tributes left in the Churchyard.
